

# Phused: Inphusion Saves Your Soul

This is one of the better future-soul compilations that's come out in awhile. Only the third (and first full-length) release from Berlin-based newcomer [Inphusion](#), the limited edition CD includes the two singles released on the imprint as well as an unusually well-curated selection of independent electronic music from around the globe.

There are enough recognizable names on *Phused* to pique your curiosity, from DJ Spinna's mellow but nevertheless neck-snapping remix of Roy Ayers' "Holiday," to the new classic Mark De Clive-Lowe and Bembe Segue UK soul tune "Heaven." But the real highlights are the people you may be hearing for the first time.

Standouts include French nu-jazzfunk bassist/producer Bruno Hovart, aka Patchworks, with a classy retro-boogie rendition of Cymande's afro-funk classic "Brothers on the Slide." Austrian neophyte Oracle's instrumental electrofunk workout "Interdimensional"—a favorite on [Benji B's Deviation](#). And NYC's own up-and-coming Spymusic supplies a groovy broken reworking of Champion Soul's "Holdin' On."
